This week the children also enjoyed a fun hands on workshop with a maths magician where they had to use their maths skills to solve the magic tricks. In Key Stage 2 they learnt tricks using maths such as recalling multiplication facts, subtracting 2-digit from 3 digit numbers, place value, square numbers and mean averages amongst others.

In Key Stage 1 and Foundation stage they learnt magic tricks and had to use their Maths skills of 'finding the difference', repeating patterns, sensible guessing, 2D and 3D shapes, counting in 2s 3s 5s 10s and more than and less than.
